Duties and Responsibilities: Faculty in the School of Statistics in the College of Liberal Arts are expected to maintain an active research program in statistics, develop and teach undergraduate and graduate courses, advise undergraduate and graduate students, and contribute service, appropriate for the rank of the appointment, to the department, college, University, and profession.

Position Qualifications: To be considered for the position, applicants must have a Ph.D. in Statistics or a closely related quantitative field. Advanced ABD's may be considered for appointment at the rank of instructor, with the stipulation that the Ph.D. is conferred in the first year of the appointment. Candidates will be evaluated according to the overall quality of their academic preparation and scholarly work, evidence of research ability, evidence of commitment to teaching and skills as a teacher, and strength of recommendations.
