## Pharmacoepidemiology

The 3rd International Conference on Pharmacoepidemiology, "Contributions of Pharmacoepidemiology to Public Health: Industry, Government, Academic and Clinical Practice Perspectives", will be held 9-11 September 1987 at the Radisson University Hotel, University of Minnesota campus, Minneapolis, Minnesota, U.S.A.
