## Japanese

The Annual Meeting for the 1988 fiscal year of the Japanese Region was held on 22 April in Tokyo. The meeting consisted of the General Assembly for business matters and a scientific meeting. At the scientific meeting, nine contributed papers, whose summaries are published in this issue, were presented and a special session titled 'Epidemiological Methods for Evaluating the Health Effect of Tobacco Smoking' was held. The following three epidemiologists were invited to the special session and gave expository lectures on the health effect of tobacco smoking, especially that of passive smoking:

Masumi Minowa (The Institute of Public Health), Usefulness and limitation of epidemiologic methods for evaluating the health effect of tobacco smoking.

Takeshi Hirayama (The Institute of Preventive Oncology), Biometric considerations on the relationship between smoking and lung cancer on the large scale cohort study.

**Tukasa Namekata** (Batelle Memorial Institute), Some problems in epidemiology of smoking and future studies.

We decided to try to increase the number of members of the Society and to unite, under a Group, those of us that were working in the application of Mathematics and Statistics to life sciences in Spain. Less than eight years later we have over 50 members and the Spanish National Group has been formed. Indeed, a Spanish Region might be around the corner. In May 1986, we organized the 1st Spanish Biometric Conference (SBC) in Granada and, quite unexpectedly, we had more than 60 contributed papers from Spanish scientists. We plan to hold this meeting every other year after 1989, to avoid conflicting with the IBCs. In summer 1989 we will have our 2nd SBC in Madrid. We invite all members of the Society to submit contributions and enjoy Spain (even more sunny in summer!).
